Times tables: emphasis on rapid recall and corresponding division facts.

In year 3 we focus on recapping the multiplication facts for the 2, 5, 10, and learn 3, 4 and 8 times tables and then transfer this knowledge to division facts. This will allow your child to have an instant recall of the facts and free up their memory for more challenging maths tasks. In the spring term, we will start timed tables tests, using Rockstars.

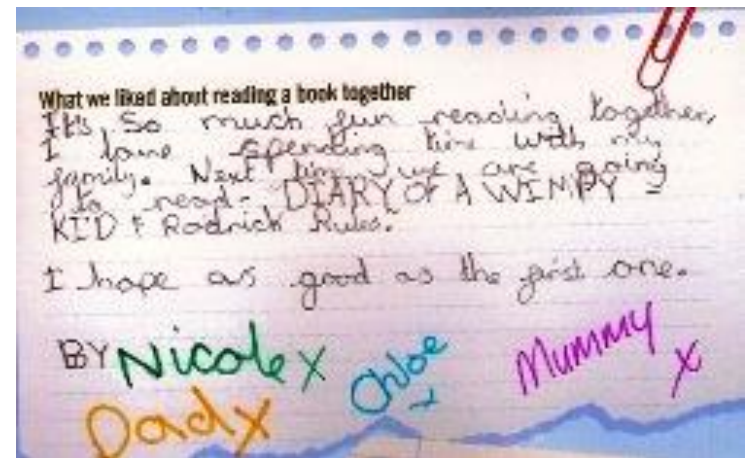
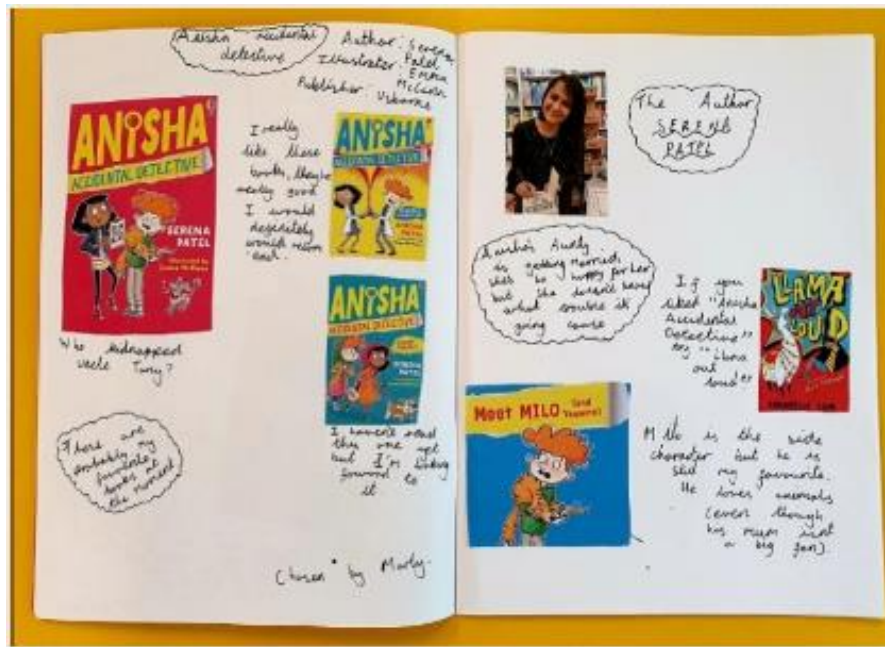
Reading Rocks! Class Journal

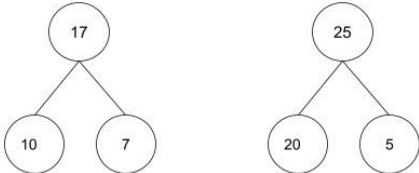
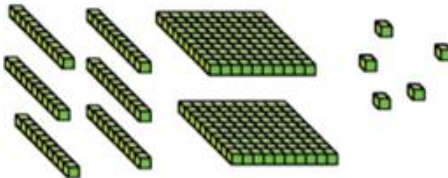
This year we are hoping
