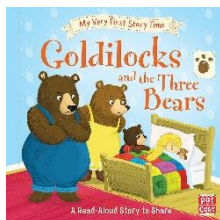
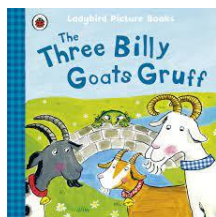
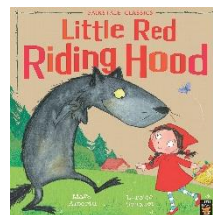


Spring 1 Our topic is...

Key texts:
Three Billy Goats Gruff
Little Red Riding Hood
Goldilocks
Three Little Pigs



Questions:

Where is this story set?

Who are the characters in this story?

Who is the good/bad character and what makes them this?

What is the problem the characters need to overcome?

Key Vocabulary:

Character: A person or other being within a narrative.

Setting: Where an event or story takes place.

Problem: A matter the characters have to solve.

Home learning opportunities: Can you make a house from sticks, straw and bricks?

- Can you take a walk outside in the woods. How would Red Riding hood have felt?
- Can you look a real life cottage from the outside. How is it different to your home?

Did you know?

Little Red Riding Hood can be dated back to be written in the 17th Century! In the French version of the story, Little Red Riding hood is eaten, but in the German version, she is rescued by the woodcutter.

Story characters:

The key characters in:

3 Billy Goats Gruff: Little Billy Goat Gruff, Middle/Medium Billy Goat Gruff and Great big Billy Goat Gruff.

Little Red Riding Hood: Little Red Riding Hood, Woodcutter, Granny, Mum and the wolf.

Goldilocks and the 3 bears: Goldilocks, baby Bear, Mummy Bear and Daddy Bear.

3 little pigs: First, second, last little pig, mummy pig
Wolf.

Fun facts: The names of the three little pigs in the original story were: Browny, Whitey, and Blacky. Each piggy had their own character: Browny was a dirty lazy pig, Whitey was clever but greedy and selfish, and Blacky was a nice little pig, neither dirty nor lazy.

Breakfast around the world: In Goldilocks and the 3 bears the bears have porridge for their breakfast. Breakfast sometimes looks different in other countries and cultures. In Poland a traditional breakfast is sandwiches with egg and tomato. In Hungary they dip bread into an egg friend in oil, they call it 'bundáskenyér'. In Bangladesh they like to have 'paratha' in the morning which is a type of flatbread.
