Key Vocabulary:

Aircraft - a vehicle that is able to fly by gaining support from the air.

Pilot - a person who flies an aircraft.

Travel - to go from one place to another.

Amelia Earhart - the first female aviator to fly solo across the Atlantic.

Vehicle - a thing used for transporting people or goods e.g. bus, car, lorry.

Locomotive - a train car that pulls the other cars along the track.

Bus - a large motor vehicle that can carry lots of passengers.

Map - a diagram of an area

Fun facts:

- A locomotive can use steam, diesel or electricity for power.
- Amelia Earhart disappeared on one of her adventures.
