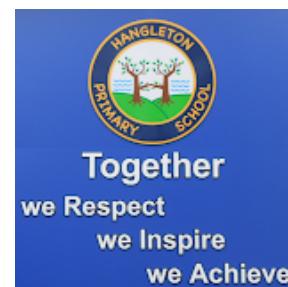

Attendance Reminder

Every school day counts, and even a seemingly high attendance rate of 95% means your child misses 9.5 days of school a year—which adds up to nearly two weeks of lost learning. Over a 7-year primary school journey, that minor gap snowballs into 66.5 missed days, meaning your child will have missed more than an entire term of education by the time they leave for secondary school.
